Health and Wellness: A New Day

Health and Wellness Centers, many with FEMA storm protection facilities, have seen an upsurge in construction in the Four State region in 2009-2010. RE Smith Construction has three health and wellness facilities currently underway.

Family Life Center, Community Health and Wellness Center, Riverton, Kansas: \$1.4 million

The Family Life Center of Riverton Kansas provides psychological and social services to regional residents, and is adding a Health and Wellness Center in 2010. The Center will serve the regional population with a full fitness facility and a FEMA Shelter.

Eastern Shawnee Tribe of Oklahoma Wellness Center , Seneca, Missouri \$1.02 million

Phase I of the Eastern Shawnee Tribe's Health and Wellness Center includes high level exercise options, such as cardio rooms and weight training equipment , as well as a Community Center kitchen area suited for a nutrition program. Phase II of this project includes a pool area and large gym, suitable for indoor Pow-Wows held in inclement weather.

Bearskin Wellness Center, Wyandotte, Oklahoma \$2.3 million

RE Smith is the General contractor for an addition to the Bearskin Wellness Center, of Wyandotte, Oklahoma which will expand upon existing facilities to include an indoor pool and spa, a cardio and weight room area, childcare/day care, and a FEMA shelter/safe room. The facility will be open to the general public of the region, Wyandotte nation officials say. .

AIA Architects Tour Facilities

Springfield AIA (American Institute of Architects) met at Close Memorial Park on Thursday, June 10, for a preview LEED tour of the Botanical Garden Center, currently under construction by RE Smith Construction. The Facility is designed to achieve Silver LEED certification, an environmental designation that begins implementation in the design stages of a facility. LEED features include sustainable landscaping using collected storm water runoff, use of natural light to increase energy efficiency, LEED approved paints and building materials, and building practices. The Building will house administration offices for the Springfield Greene-County Parks, a teaching center for the Botanical Gardens, and a community use facility for receptions and gatherings. Cost of the project is \$3.2 million. Mike Freitas is the Project manager, Curtis Rice is the Superintendent.

Orthopaedic Specialists for the Four States, Surgery Center and 23 hour Room Completed May 2010

Facility Provides New Options in Surgery

RE Smith Construction completed the 23 hour room for Orthopaedic Specialists of the Four States in May 2010 with the addition of a post operative "23 hour room" wing. The Surgical Center of the new facility features a separate entrance, post-op monitoring area, home style furnished rooms, and comfortable family waiting areas both in and outside of the "23 hour" areas. The medical facility totals 258,000 square feet of medical office and treatment space. Rodney Longenecker, is the Project Manager; Tom Jones is the Superintendent. Cost of the medical center project was \$7 million.
